The CAFOD Lent Family Fast Day was last Friday and if you have brought your Cafod envelope with you then please put it in the second collection after mass. Cafod continue to do amazing work around the world so we are so pleased to be supporting them.

24 hours for the Lord

A few years ago Pope Francis called upon each Diocese to hold 24 hours of adoration during Lent during which people can receive the sacrament of Reconciliation. In our Deanery, the 24 hours of adoration and reconciliation will be travelling round the Deanery and will be coming to Holy Name from **4pm – 6pm on Saturday 30th March** (i.e., leading up to Saturday 6pm Mass). Fr David is travelling back from the Parish Pilgrimage to Rome so Fr Dominic O’Hara will be here to celebrate the sacrament of Reconciliation for anyone who wants to.

Lent Holy Hours

As well as the 24 hours for the Lord (see above) there will be an additional two holy hours during which Fr David will be available for the sacrament of reconciliation. There will be adoration also, so just pop in for however long you wish to, and the holy hour will finish with benediction. These will be on **Monday 8th April and Monday 15th April both 6.30 – 7.30pm.**

Lenten Soup Lunches

Each Friday during Lent there will be Mass at 11.30am, Stations of the Cross at 12 noon, followed by a Frugal Lunch. All welcome.

Getting into Lent
